Full Supply List

In each week of activities, there's a supply list. You can quickly scan the list to see what you need for the week. Most items are supplies from the home (office, kitchen, kids toys, etc).

Below is a list of supplies to do every activity in the month of February.

Craft Items:

- eye droppers
- glue
- pen/markers
- paper / cardstock
(any, colored, red, pink)
- ribbon, string or yarn
- scissors
- tape (any, painter's)
- various small craft items
- buttons
- craft (Popsicle) sticks
- google eyes (optional)
- beads
- pipe cleaners
- glitter
- hot glue/glue gun
- pencil

Recycling:

- plastic bottle
- bubble wrap
- cereal boxes
- clear jars
- clear bottle with lid
- empty wipes container

Kitchen Items:

- chopsticks (or 2 pencils)
- small dishes/bowls
- toothpicks
- wax paper
- funnel
- ice cube tray / muffin tin
- spoons
- kitchen tongs
- heart cookie cutter

Food Items:

- food coloring (variety, blue)
- baking soda
- vinegar
- water
- various pantry items
- vegetable oil
- peanut butter (alternative)
- toasted bread
- colored o-shaped cereal
- corn meal

Around the House:

- cotton balls
- clothespins / paper clips
- shaving cream
- toy trucks / other toys
- Lego or other blocks
- toy ring

Supplies Tip: Go through the supply list at the beginning of the month and check off what you have. If you don't have something, **before you buy it**, check the activity it is needed for to see if there's a supply substitute, or ask in the Member Community for suggestions.

- 28** **Monday | Cotton Ball Transfer:**
Strengthen fine motor skills by transferring cotton balls with chopsticks from one bowl to the other!
- chopsticks (or 2 pencils)
cotton balls
small dishes/bowls*
- 29** **Tuesday | Colorful Glue Suncatcher:**
Spread a thin layer of glue onto some wax paper. Using an eye dropper, add some drops of food coloring to the glue. With a toothpick, swirl the colors around.

glue

wax paper*
- 30** **Wednesday | Name String Scavenger Hunt:**
String one long yarn around a room. Clip the letters of their name onto the string in order from start to finish. Follow the string to find the letters to make your name!
- clothespins/paper clips
markers
paper
string or yarn*
- 31** **Thursday | Blow Up a Balloon:**
Put 2 oz of vinegar in plastic bottle. Funnel in 1 TBSP of baking soda in a balloon. Secure balloon to opening of bottle. When ready, drop baking soda out of the balloon and into the bottle. Watch the balloon blow up!

- 1** **Friday | "I Love You" Scavenger Hunt:**
Cut out several hearts from paper. Write one thing you love about your child on each heart. Hide one heart per day until Valentine's Day and have your child hunt for it! Read it to them and hang on their bedroom door.

- 2/3** **Over the Weekend Family Activity:**
Work on a simple family tree together (as a family) to show relationships between immediate family and grandparents.



Colorful Glue Suncatcher

Supplies:

eye droppers
food coloring
glue
toothpicks
wax paper

Spread a thin layer of glue onto wax paper.

2

Use an eye dropper to add drops of food coloring to the glue.

3

Create swirls of color in the glue with toothpicks.

Tips:

To hang in the window - use a hole puncher, place some string or a pipe cleaner through the hole and tape to the window.

These will take a day or two to dry. Once they are completely dry, you will be able to peel them off the wax paper.

If you don't have wax paper, use a plastic baggy or the lid from a plastic container (yogurt, sour cream, etc)
