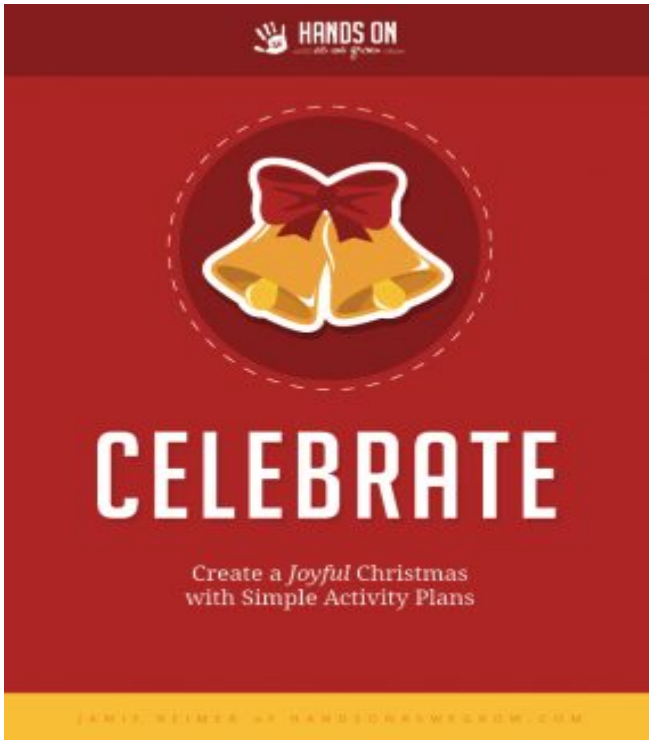


Create a Joyful Christmas with Simple Activity Plans

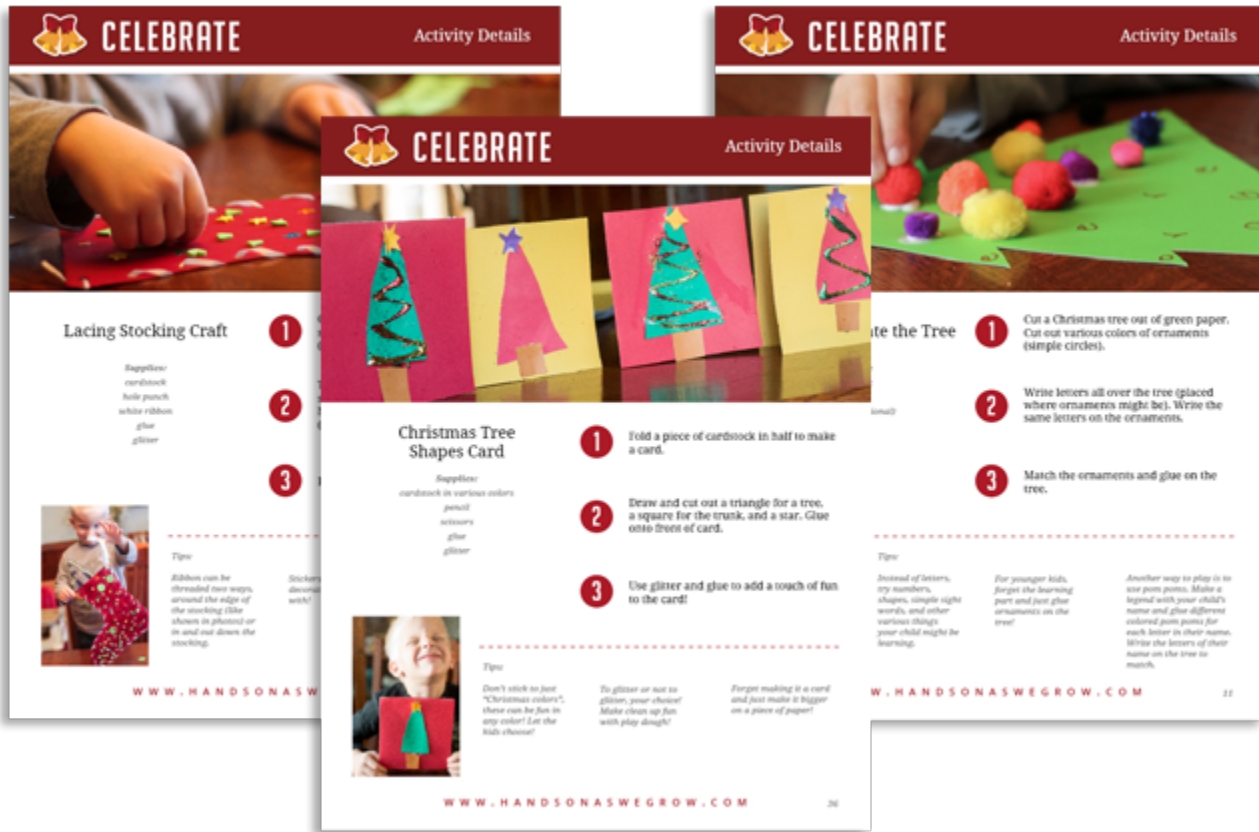



Making it Easy for You to Create a Joyful Christmas!

Have everything you need on one quick spot for fun this holiday season! 28 quick and simple Christmas activities with instructions and photos. Plus there are tips for each activity with ideas to make this work for younger or older kids, or other ways to do the craft or activity! The activity plans are each an entire week of activities (plus a supply list) on one sheet of paper, making it easy to print out and pin it up for the week. That also means that each activity is explained in 2-3 short sentences. They are the simplest of activities that use the supplies you have.



Activity Plan: Week 1

Monday: Draw, and cut, a spiral from a large circle. Lay flat and decorate with sequins, glitter and a star in the center! Punch a hole in the center and tie a string to hang up your spiral Christmas tree! (page 16)

Tuesday: Hide gift boxes around the house in secret spots. Towards the evening, or draw the shades, hand them flashlights to look for all the hidden gift boxes. (page 18)

Wednesday: Make a snowman card.

Thursday: Cut a triangle out of red paper to make Santa's hat, glue onto card. Flip a plastic cup in glue and dab onto top of triangle, and along bottom edge. Sprinkle with salt, or white glitter. (page 20)

Friday: Decorate a white fridge or door to be a snowman! Cut out snowman facial features from paper and a scarf from wrapping paper. Tape onto the fridge to make a snowman. (page 22)

Saturday: Cut two stockings out of paper. Punch holes around edge. Tie ribbons onto beginning hole and thread around the stocking. Decorate stocking as desired. (page 23)

Sunday: Break out the holiday music and learn a song together.

Materials: green cardstock, pencil, scissors, glue, glitter, sequins, flashlights, gift boxes, white paper, red paper, cardstock, salt, white glitter, craft sticks, glue, string, green paper, white cardstock, red paper, sequins, colored paper, tape, string, red paper, white paper, green paper, red & purple markers, red & purple string, parchment, markers, red & purple string, cardstock, white paper, salt, white glitter, green paper, white paper, red & purple string, white paper, red & purple string, white paper, red & purple string, cardstock, hole punch, white ribbon, glue, glitter.

Activity Plan: Week 3

Monday: Tape stripes onto paper. Finger paint with red. Let dry and remove tape. Cut a candy cane shagel! Hang on a door knob, or tree! (page 24)

Tuesday: Cut out colored light bulbs from paper and hide them around the house. Go on a "Christmas light" scavenger hunt. Tape them on a string when they're found and decorate the tree with them! (page 26)

Materials: poster's tape, white cardstock, red paper, sequins, colored paper, tape, string, red paper, white paper, green paper, red & purple markers, red & purple string, parchment, markers, red & purple string, cardstock, white paper, salt, white glitter, green paper, white paper, red & purple string, white paper, red & purple string, white paper, red & purple string, cardstock, hole punch, white ribbon, glue, glitter.

Activity Plan: Week Four

Monday: Cut a tree from green paper. Draw lines for garland on it. Decorate tree with stickers along the lines of garland. (page 30)

Tuesday: Cut out several Christmas trees and matching presents from various wrapping paper scraps. Glue trees onto paper. Find and glue the presents under the matching Christmas tree. (page 31)

Wednesday: Spend the day decorating the kid's room for the holidays! Make it special. Have an extra tree? Hang up lights! (page 32)

Thursday: Fold a piece of cardstock to make a card. Cut a triangle and glue onto card to make a Christmas tree. Cut and glue on a square to make the trunk. Cut and glue a star on the top of the tree. Decorate as desired. (page 33)

Friday: Draw the outline of a snowman on blue paper. Trace and attach marasmallows to outline with glue. Add facial features and arms with markers or pieces of paper and glue. (page 37)

Saturday: Cut a quarter "piece of pie" out of a paper plate. Form the plate into a cone and staple together. Paint the tree and decorate with glue, glitter and sequins. (page 38)

Sunday: Read holiday books by candlelight!

Materials: green paper, white markers, wrapping paper, scissors, glue or glue stick, paper, building decorations, cardstock in various colors, pencil, scissors, glue, glitter, blue paper, marker, glue, small marasmallows, cotton balls (optional), paper plate, marker, glue, glitter, sequins.
